MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN



SPRING ACTIVITY

Since the last newsletter we have been busy with 2 successful competitions at Downe Farm open to other local BRC clubs and our first summer members only competition at the Paxtons' field. Results from these shows are at the end of the newsletter and on the club website. The show jumping was bitterly cold but a busy and fun afternoon. We had booked the arena for four hours and the show lasted just exactly three hours and fifty nine minutes. It was well attended and everyone appreciated the chance to compete after such a muddy winter. As I write this sweltering in my shorts, mud seems a long way away, yet it was only 2 months ago! The dressage show with WSDDC qualifier was also well supported for the full day and a lot warmer than the show jumping. The weather was definitely warming up for the competition at the Paxton's field. It was a fun, friendly morning on May Bank Holiday with a sunny day and a chance to meet up with members in a relaxed atmosphere. Sadly we had to cancel the members competition in June due to lack of time to organise it – with the club competitions and running the Area 12 combined training we realized we had just taken on too much. MEMBERS SHOW SURVEY

Thanks to everyone who completed the survey. It is so helpful to get an indication of what members are looking for from their club, specifically in this instance our regular club competitions that are usually members only.

Summary

Just over 50% of the membership replied and most of these said they were likely to come to a members only competition.

Dressage and show jumping are the most popular. Although some said they would like HT or XC, but it is not clear that they meant for a small members only competition.

Both suggested venues are fine with most who responded.

Weekends are definitely more popular than weekday evenings.

As well as the responses to the specific questions (see below), the open answers indicated quite a bit of interest in events that mixed training with competition. These ideas are being developed by the committee. Some members also mentioned having more competitions open to other clubs – again something we have taken up for the next event.

Responses to individual questions

1. 70 members responded to the survey out of 125 total membership – just over 50%. 45 said they would come to a competition, 21 said they might and 4 said they would not.
2. Reasons given for not coming to one of our competitions were mainly either competing elsewhere or family commitments.

COMING UP FOR SUMMER AND BEYOND

Dressage and Clear Round Jumping Competition. Schedules for July 14th competition have already been sent out and dressage entries close on Monday July 9th. This show has 2 classes that are West Somerset and Devon Dressage Championship (WSDDC) Qualifier and is open to members of Witheridge RC as well as the following local Riding Clubs - West Somerset, Exeter, Quantock, Sid & Otter Valley, North Devon, Blackdown Hills & Ilfracombe & District RC. During the year these clubs host qualifying classes and the championships will be held at Kings Sedgmoor Equestrian Centre on Sunday 28th October 2018. The first three eligible competitors in qualifying classes as well as the highest placed junior and RoR if outside top 3 will qualify. To be eligible, horses/ponies in the Prelim class must have no BD points (BD prelim points do not count) and those in the Novice class no more than 124 BD points at close of entries to the WSDD Championships. In addition, **combinations** are ineligible to compete at the same level or below if they have been WSDD Champion or Reserve Champion or placed 1st – 6th individually at any BRC National Dressage Championship in any year prior to qualification. There will also be an Elementary class at the championships open to horses with less than 199 BD points at close of entries to the WSDD championships who have not competed at Medium level or above and satisfy the criteria in the paragraph above. Members only show jumping training competition on Friday 17th August in the afternoon/evening. This will consist of group lessons of approximately 4 horses of similar ability over a full set of jumps immediately followed by a friendly and fun competition with rosettes. Day Camps at Downe Farm Event Centre, Witheridge

On Thursday 16th August and Saturday 6th October 2018.

The day will include Flatwork, showjumping/Fun with Poles, (on all weather surface) and Cross Country (outdoors, weather permitting). Come and do a whole day or half a day, but most importantly, join us for a sociable picnic lunch. The idea is to run 4 groups of no more than 4 people, the cost of the whole day is £70.00 per person for 4 hours of instruction. Half a day (2 sessions) is £35.00. You will be asked to bring a plate of food for an American style supper, a chair to sit on, something to drink and a large haynet and bucket of water for your horse to munch on during lunch. Ideally starting at 10am sharp, breaking for lunch around 12pm, and re-starting at 2.30pm, to allow the horses-and riders- a nice rest in between. Should the weather be unkind, and render us unable to carry on, (we would know this the day before at the latest) the contingency plan would be to arrange time slots for flatwork in the morning and showjumping in the afternoon in the indoor school. We are asking for full payment at time of booking, fully refunded if cancelled due to weather, but otherwise only refunded if we can fill your space.

Groups on offer will all include flatwork and include:-

- Group 1 – Fun with Poles. Basic XC instruction and very small fences, very low key.
- Group 2- Up to 70 ish cms jumps & XC
- Group 3 – Up to 80 ish cms jumps & XC
- Group 4 – 80 cm and over.

Don't forget that the Paxtons very kindly allow members to use their field and club jumps or dressage arena during the summer. You must book with Mary Paxton in advance. See later in the newsletter for full details.

TRAINING NEWS

We have a new training group planning and organizing the training. Tamsin O'Connor and Ros Fisher-Smith have stood down after 6 years – it certainly was time for a change! Sophie Marshall and Amelia Green continue and have been joined by Demelza Barnes, Kim Gough and Nicky Day. They are already running show jumping with Mary Baillie; flatwork with Irene Perrett and XC with Andrew Lovell. In addition, Kim Gough is currently in the process of organising a Mathew Lawrence Ridden Showing Clinic – Mathew is a top show producer who has won the M&M Championship at HOYS and is currently riding one of the Queen's Highlands. She is also looking into a Horse Whisperer demo which will deal with loading problems, difficult horses, etc.

Dressage to Music Qualifier

There was no Area 12 qualifier arranged this year so our representatives, Carol Luxton and Sharon Routley, had to go down to St Leonards in Cornwall and join the Area 19 qualifying competition. Carol did the Novice to Music qualifier on Foxy and came 4th. Sharon did the Open Novice which she won and has qualified for the championships at Bury Farm. They both rode the Novice Pairs to Music and came second, just missing out on qualification.

Carol and Sharon are well known to members as part of our successful Quadrille team. Unfortunately, due to various personal commitments, the team have decided not to compete this year.

Area 12 Horse Trials from Helen Goff

As Caroline was busy with preparations for her daughter's wedding, I came back as Team Manager just for this year!

We managed to enter 2 teams at both 80 and 90 and initially had a 100 team as well but sadly lost two members before the day so Caroline Thompson and Amelia Green represented WRC as individuals. Caroline and Wilkismoor Wichita (Bear to his friends) had a superb day, leading after dressage and then followed this up with a double clear so could not be beaten. An emphatic win for a partnership that have represented WRC so well at all levels. A double clear for Amelia and Mr Chris meant they finished a very creditable 11th. In the 100plus, Clare Wilson rode Amira as a non qualifying individual (as she was ineligible to compete as a qualifier as she was also in the 80). Sadly, an uncharacteristic 20 penalties XC meant they finished 7th.

Our 80 qualifying team came 6th. Clare Wilson rode Kim Dart's Jaysans into 3rd, Sarah Midwinter and Marlise were 9th, Sally Watts and her youngster Penpont Denver 17th and Jane Phillips with her striking TB mare Fair Duchess "Bryony" 18th, having incurred an unfortunate 20 penalties XC when Bryony slipped. Smile of the day has to go to Sarah when she was told she had finished bang on the optimum time XC!

Clare Wilson was having a very busy day which turned out to be even more successful when she won Section I with Anne Plume's Florence (with the best finishing score of the whole day!!!), closely followed by Jenny Lo-vel and Holywell Cavaliers Pride in 2nd. Also, maintaining the team standard, both with double clears were Nicky Day and Greycroft Ronan 7th, Tamsin O'Connor and Mavericks Cape Caracus 11th. This meant that they finished a huge 12 penalties ahead of the top qualifying team so WON the 80 overall and are Area Champions (as were non qualifying).

Onto the 90 and it wasn't the best day for our non qualifying team as we started with only 3 members after Lisa Manley's Will incurred an untimely minor tweak so couldn't compete. Amelia's Final Try pulled a shoe so had to be withdrawn, Fiona Rawle's mare Lady Harlequin took exception to the new ditch on the cross country and poor Charlotte Hare, a new member who started really well, 3rd in the section with a dressage score of 27.8, but sadly Laissez Faere wasn't keen on jumping. Hopefully we will see them all competing for WRC again.

The qualifying team fared rather better. Emily Northam and Brendon's Blaze and Sharon Routley with Holly, back after an injury break, matched each other with good dressage tests, one fence down showjumping and 4.4 time penalties cross country to finish 8th and 9th in Section A. Andrew Parry (Autumn Bright Star) and Jenny Lo-vel (Holywell Cavalier Classic) both achieved sub 30 dressage scores and finished 2nd and 3rd in Section B, only 0.1 penalties apart and this meant that the team WON convincingly and are also off to the Championships with Caroline at the beginning of August. Hooray!

Many thanks to all our members who represented the club so well, not only in performance but turning up in good time and making such an effort with your turnout. You made my "job" as easy as it could be!

Thank you also to Caroline Lowes, Maggi Woodward and Ros Fisher-Smith for your support and assistance on the day and to Mary Baillie and Mary Paxton for the technical help.

Area 12 Competitions 2018

These competitions are open to Senior and Junior members. They are for individuals and / or teams of 4. We can enter qualifying teams and / or non-qualifying teams (or individuals). The standard of competitors is usually very high and the jumping courses are always up to height, so you must be currently competing confidently at the appropriate level, particularly if part of a qualifying team. Schedules will be on the BRC Area 12 website www.brcarea12.org.uk and circulated by e-mail as and when they become available together with further details, but if you would like to take part as a team member please do register your interest in advance. Please check the BRC Handbook to check that you and your horse are eligible for the class you wish to compete in <http://www.bhs.org.uk/enjoy-riding/british-riding-clubs/brc-handbook>.

Please note, if entering a qualifier: As well as the Area entry fee there is an additional BRC fee (preliminary entry fee) per class which is around £7.25/team member and £9.00/individual. Your horse must have up to date correct vaccinations. You must be prepared to compete at the Championship should you qualify as part of a team, the club will help towards Championship entry fees and stabling but you need to pay your own fuel / transport fees.

If you would like to compete in any of the competitions please contact Tamsin or the relevant Team Manager (see front of newsletter) at least a week before the Preliminary closing date.

Happy 30th Anniversary Witheridge Riding Club!



30 years ago 5 local riders met to discuss the possibility of forming a riding club. Yvonne Somerville, now living in Australia writes:

"The thing I remember most was the inaugural meeting, which was held at Jessie Morton's house. There was Jessie, myself, Vanessa Cheffings, Suzanne Wilcox and Sandy Blight. Other meetings were often held at Suzanne's home, she was our secretary. We all agreed a Riding Club would be great for the community, and thus a committee was formed. We had some great times and I'm delighted that the club is still going from strength to strength, and that my daughter is following in my footsteps!" (Her daughter, Cindy is now on the committee)

Three of those inaugural members are still active today. We all know Vanessa Cheffings and the club still uses the Cheffings' facilities and Vanessa is a popular club trainer. Suzanne only recently stepped down from the committee and she regularly acts as a helper and especially as a scorer for our dressage shows. Jessie is no longer an active member but she only recently judged the dressage at one of our shows. The Foxdon cup for show jumping was donated by Jessie as Foxdon is her stud name for the horses she has bred. Foxdon Sunny Jim currently competes BE with Tom Hawke. Sandy Blight is sadly no longer with us. She is commemorated by a club trophy awarded to members who fight on to continue riding despite adversity. Sandy continued riding and supporting the club all through her battle with cancer. In the early days shows were held at various farms around Witheridge. We are especially grateful to Brian and Jen Peace, long term members, who farmed Willicroft and used to let us use their fields for the shows. I remember when I joined in about 1994, my horror at having to ride my spooky 5 year old over the bridge Across the Link Road. In fact it was no problem and over the years I never saw a horse worried by it – just several riders hesitating the first time they crossed.

Sophie Marshall has memories of these early shows:

Don't know what year these were, but we did dressage at Willicroft in thick fog once, the judge could hardly see down the arena. And another year we put the gazebo up one or two days before the show at Willicroft, again, and it blew across the field and down into the Link road !

I also remember the summer shows at Yvonne Somerville 's. One rained all day and Cheryl kept coming back to us to enter another class, she said she couldn't get any wetter, so we may as well carry on!

I competed with Jen Peace in one of our dressage teams at Taunton racecourse.

Also when setting up for these shows, we used to be there all ready to go, but had to wait for the baler to take the hay away before we could start putting up the rings rings and jumps!

Even in those days, the age for joining as a junior member was 15. Hermione Perry writes,

I remember being really frustrated moving to Devon at 12 years old and not being allowed to join (I had been a member of our club in Essex). Membership was top of my birthday list for when I turned 15. Riding Club has always been much more my 'thing' than pony club!

I used to love the Equine Superstar competitions we did - some handy pony, a dressage test and a round of jumps. Our old Minstrel normally won, hence why we donated a trophy in his honour (though I think I did beat my sister once!) In those days we had to put up with a deep and (often flooded) arena at the Cheffings - how things have changed there now!!

AI also remember the brilliant summer show WRC used to run near Puddington. It was quite a big and popular show in its day.

Apparently team selection was easy in the early days. You got in the team if you actually had up to date vaccinations!

Many long standing members have taken their turns at being on the committee, for example Anne Plume, Ros Bolt, Suzanne Willcox and Sarah Midwinter. In fact, Sophie Marshall is starting her second stint this year. Sarah Midwinter writes:

I joined WRC in 1995, introduced by Anne Plume, when I kept a horse at livery with her after a long break from riding of 20 years. The club was still fairly young, (my number is 91), and the founder members, Vanessa Cheffings, Jessie Moreton, Jen Peace & Sandy Blight were still very active. I remember being nervous to turn up at things at first but was soon delighted to meet so many lovely local horsey people and it was a whole new social life to discover too. WRC ran loads of events, at various farms round and about, some over 'interesting' terrain (not being so constrained by Health & Safety then), including Downe Farm which was relatively grand as it had a "home built" xc course round the farm and a small outdoor school - what luxury! I did badly at most of these competitions but thoroughly enjoyed myself. I was in awe of the very efficient Committee, of which I remember Suzanne Willcox and Sonia Sawyer in particular, never thought then that one day I would be club Secretary myself for many years. There were also plenty of non riding events to go to and I made some great lifelong friends. Happily, although we have lost some dear friends from those early days, many of them (us!) are still around and going strong! Sadly I can't find any photos, but it is true to say WRC has played a huge part in my life and still continues to do so. The current Committee do a wonderful job to ensue WRC is still going strong & long may it continue to provide inspiration, help and entertainment to local riders.

But when using our field can you please follow these simple rules

.....

Firstly it is a stock farm and there will be sheep in the field on some occasions ... so please shut all gates at all times

If in doubt regarding field conditions due to bad weather please ring and check with me on my mobile 07549698576 even if you have booked in

Please move arena if and when necessary and always leave a schooling arena up with the corners and white boards in place after use.. several members hack up to use the field for schooling and don't want to have to build an arena each time..

You can use other flat areas of the field if the arena is getting cut up .. but please take care with the sheep and don't canter all over the place if you want a good canter please use the bridle path (This goes down field next to the schooling field .. again please keep to it not do not gallop round the field.

If you use any letters please pull them up and put them back under the hedge .. or the lambs wear them as necklaces

Please do not leave poles in schooling area ... they need to be put back under the hedge as do the fillers

Do not use plastic poles for trot/schooling workthey break if trodden on so there are some wooden ones in the show jumping area especially for this

All competition organisers please text or email me to let me know your setting up plans as we like to know who is going to be about

Instructors/trainers / lesson organisers ...please confirm number of riders and lessons each week and use other flat area of field if the arena is getting cut up

Move show jumps and arena between lessons if ground getting cut up

Please leave show jumping area tidy any spare poles etc. put back under hedge neatly
